Inhabitants of West Kent 1487

The following listing is taken from a Common Plea Roll at the Public Office (CP 40/997 Record commencing on membrane 148) and was originally incorrectly reported by Henry R. Plomer in the British Archivist. 1 The listing forms part of the evidence in the dispute between Sir John Legh and his receiver, John Tuttesham, described as late of West Peckham, Kent, gent., who collected the rents for Michaelmas 3 Henry VII (1487). He is almost certainly the John Tuttesham given in 1574 as grandfather of **Thomas** the Tuttesham of West Peckham.2 The hearing of the action for the recovery of this money took place in the Court of Common Pleas in the Michaelmas Term of 3 Henry VIII (1511) when John Tuttesham claims to have fully accounted with the said John Legh at Stokwell [Stockwell], Surrey on the 20 October 4 Henry VII (1488).

Sir John Legh of Stockwell, Surrey was made a Knight of Bath on the 17 November 1501 upon the marriage of Prince Arthur the elder brother of king Henry VIII.³ In his will proved

on 10 December 1523 Sir John Legh, knight, states that he bought this Kentish estate of Thomas Barham and John Holden and Anne his wife.4 The inquisition post mortem dated at Gravesend on 25 November 15 Henry VIII (1523) for his Kentish estates has survived.5 He was possessed of two parts of the manors of Oxnothe. Stansted, Offham. Ditton, Mascalles and Copgrove, Snodbeme and Peckham in Hadlow, divided into five parts. Details of his actual land holdings recorded in the IPM are given as footnotes below. When he died 27 August 1523 his heir was John Legh his nephew, then aged 21 years, the son of his brother Ralph Legh.

In the following transcript *quadrans* (farthing) is shown as ½d and obolus (half-penny) as ½d, ¼d and ½d as ¾d and half a farthing as ⅙d. All Roman figures have been changed to Arabic numbers.

By his first wife Sybil he had three children Elizabeth who married Henry Barham of Teston, Margaret and Ann: Sussex Archaeological Collections, Vol. 48 p. 80. His second wife was Isabell daughter and coheir of Ottiwell Worsley by whom he had two daughters, one of whom Joyce, born 1480, was married first to Ralph Legh of Stockwell, Undersheriff of London, and secondly to Lord Edmund Howard, third son of the Duke of Norfolk: Rev. Howard Chadwick, Notes on the church and parish of West Peckham, (1935) p. 27.

Oxen Hoath is in the parish of West Peckham. J. K. Wallenberg, The Places names of Kent, (1934) p. 159 and Hasted vol. V, (1798) pp. 63-64, IPM: 200a. land, 40a. meadow, 100a. pasture, 40a. wood held of the heirs of Henry Grey, Lord of Codnore by fealty and rent of one pair of spurs. Valued in all issues above the repris £23-7s 31/4d. ⁷ Dr Gordon Ward's Place Name Index says that in 1584 the manor of Badilsmere was held with that of Oxenhoth manor. The reference for this is Lambert Larking Kent Note Book X/257/66 & X/250/39. These are deposited at CKS in U1823 but were unavailable for examination as the collection is uncatalogued. Hasted, vol. V, (1798) p. 23, says, 'At a small distance southward from Plaxtool-street, lies the seat of Fairlawn, the house of which is at the extremity of the parish of

The manor lands in the IPM not given in the above were 140a. land, 40a. wood in Stansted held of William Archbishop of Canterbury by fealty and rent for all services; value £12 7s 11d and 220a. land, 6a. meadow and 140a. wood in manor of Ditton held of the heirs of Henry Grey, Lord of Codnore for a rent for all services. The value above the repris for this was £20 12s 7d.
